Liturgy of the Word

Traditionally, we think of the table of the Lord as the place where we receive the bread of the Eucharist. And this is surely true. But since the Second Vatican Council, we also refer to the "table of the word" (the ambo) where we receive Christ's teaching.

If the Word is truly "bread from heaven," then we ought to not hurry the Liturgy of the Word." During the Liturgy of the Word, we hear of God's mighty deeds on behalf of our salvation through the proclamation of the Scriptures and are challenged to live so that we might attain eternal life.

During the Liturgy of the Eucharist, we again remember God's mighty deeds, and this time we are called forth to God's banquet table to receive the Food that sustains us on our journey.

It is good to occasionally evaluate the relationship of the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist so that both are celebrated as equally important. Sufficient time and care must be taken in preparing the Liturgy of the Word and its ritual celebration. As we prepare the readings ahead of time so we are able to hear them proclaimed with meaning, we might also ask ourselves how this word relates to the prayers of the Liturgy of the Eucharist.
