# Camino de Santiago

Prior to Covid, it had been our practice to undertake an almost annual pilgrimage to Santiago de Compostela.

The Camino de Santiago or in English the Way of St. James, is a network of pilgrims' ways or pilgrimages leading to the shrine of the apostle James in the cathedral of Santiago de Compostela in Galicia in northwestern Spain, where tradition holds that the remains of the apostle are buried.

Created and established after the discovery of the relics of Saint James the Great at the beginning of the 9th century, the Way of St. James became a major pilgrimage route of medieval Christianity from the 10th century onwards. But it was only after the end of the Granada War in 1492, that Pope Alexander VI officially declared the Camino de Santiago to be one of the "three great pilgrimages of Christendom", along with Jerusalem and the Via Francigena to Rome.

In 1987, the Camino, which encompasses several routes in Spain, France, and Portugal, was declared the first Cultural Route of the Council of Europe. Since 2013, the Camino has attracted more than 200,000 pilgrims each year, with an annual growth rate of more than 10 percent. Pilgrims come mainly on foot and often from nearby cities, requiring several days of walking to reach Santiago. The French Way gathers two-thirds of the walkers, but other minor routes are experiencing a growth in popularity.

Those of us who have participated in previous pilgrimages have found it to be a most wonderful experience, and in recent times a number of other parishioners have expressed the desire to share this experience for the first time.

We hope to back on the Pilgrim Path in 2025, with the dates **June 30<sup>th</sup> to July 8<sup>th</sup> or 9<sup>th</sup>** being considered the best option.
