The Liturgical Year ... preparing to turn over a new leaf.


When we think about a year we often think of it in terms of its seasons. Each season has its particular feel, its own customs and activities that we associate with it.

We adapt or change according to the season. We wear different clothes, play different sports, and eat different foods. We even associate colours with different seasons.

The Liturgical Year is similar in the way it is organised. It provides particular occasions and whole seasons to ritualize the significant movements in our Christian life.

In the Liturgical Year every season or feast day has its own unique symbols and colour which help us to explore and be involved in the mystery of the incarnation, birth, life, death and resurrection of Jesus.

We begin the Liturgical Year on the First Sunday of Advent then move to Christmas, Ordinary Time, Lent, Triduum or Three Days, Easter, Pentecost and Ordinary Time again, **finishing with the feast of Christ the King.**



Christ The King

There is a delicious irony surrounding this feast, the Feast of Christ the King. A feast established in the 1920s' when the world had many kings, in that era people readily understood kingship and gave the necessary obeisance to the office if not to the person. Kings are thin on the ground today, even the existing ones are faced with constant questioning about their position.

The irony is the model of kingship given in God's Word today, it is the model of a lowly shepherd being king with the characteristics of a shepherd. In Ezekiel the underlying reason for the portrayal of a shepherd king is that the traditional kings of the time through their selfish exercise of kingly power have been the cause of many of their subjects being sent into exile in Babylon. Jesus, the Son of Man, exercising his kingly role uses Ezekiel type categories in judgement of the nations gathered before him.

The disciple of Jesus, is the one who reacts positively in the face of hunger, thirst, strangers, nakedness, sickness, imprisonment. If we want to talk of kingship in the case of Jesus then it has to be the shepherd king not the king of power and majesty. The local community is proactive, not simply servicing the needs of the local flock or community, but actively searching, seeking out, rescuing the lost and strayed, caring for the injured and weak.
